





Maya Angelou : a creative and courageous voice

America's poet -- A biography of American author Maya Angelou that discusses her childhood, experiences with racism and segregation, accomplishments, and other related topics; and includes photographs, a time line, and an interview with Wanda Phipps.

Joe Biden

Examines the life and achievements of Joe Biden, a long-time senator elected as vice-president in 2008.

Ray Bradbury : legendary fantasy writer.

A biography of American author Ray Bradbury that discusses his childhood, education, struggles and accomplishments, and other related topics; and includes photographs, a time line, and an interview with R. L. Stine.

Calamity Jane : her life and her legend.

Examines the life of the Wild West heroine who was transformed into a legendary figure in the public mind.

Rachel Carson : a twentieth-century life.

Examines the life and career of marine biologist Rachel Carson; discussing her childhood, education, research, publications, personal life, and fight against cancer.

Rachel Carson : a voice for the natural world.

A biography of environmentalist Rachel Carson that discusses her childhood, education, accomplishments and struggles, and other related topics; and includes photographs, a time line, and an interview with Carl Pope and Albert Meyerhoff.

Cesar Chavez : leader for migrant farm workers.

Examines the life of the Mexican American labor organizer who demanded rights for migrant farm workers.

Walt Disney : the mouse that roared.

An exploration of the life and career of Walt Disney, the creator of Mickey Mouse who worked as an animator, producer, screenwriter, and theme park founder.

Frederick Douglass.

An exploration of the life of Frederick Douglass that discusses his childhood as a slave, escape from bondage, literary works, career as a political activist, role in the Civil War, and more; and includes a chronology, a time line, a glossary, and suggestions for further reading.

Materials for Biography Project

Henry Ford : an unauthorized biography.

Biography of Henry Ford, famous for building the internal combustion engine, which he later used to create the automobile.

The Amazing Life of Benjamin Franklin.

A biography of the eighteenth-century printer, inventor, and statesman who played an influential role in the early history of the United States.

Meet Ben Franklin.

A short biography of American patriot, inventor, and statesman, Benjamin Franklin, examining his childhood and work as a printer, his many inventions, and his role in the independence of America.

Bill Gates.

Examines the life of Bill Gates, his early interest in computers, the founding of Microsoft, his success as a businessman, his family life and philanthropic activities.

Bill Gates : a twentieth century life.

Profiles the life and achievements of Microsoft cofounder Bill Gates, discussing how he became such a success and his philanthropic activities.

Genghis Khan.

A biography of Genghis Khan, the Mongolian leader who, by conquest, created an empire that stretched from Mongolia through the Middle East.

Jane Goodall : a twentieth-century life.

Presents a personal profile of primatologist Jane Goodall, discussing her childhood in France and England, the influences that led her to a career observing and studying chimpanzees in Africa, her marriages and child, and the causes and charities she supported in later life.

Alexander Hamilton : Creating a Nation.

A brief biography of Alexander Hamilton, the founding father who was to become the nation's first Secretary of the Treasury.

Houdini : the handcuff king.

A brief biography of escape artist Harry Houdini written in graphic comic format that reveals the secret of some of his stunts.

Materials for Biography Project

Joan of Arc : warrior saint of France.

A biography of fifteenth-century national heroine of France, Joan of Arc, who was tried and executed for heresy by the British in 1431.

Steve Jobs : the brilliant mind behind Apple.

A biography of Apple's cofounder Steve Jobs, that describes his California childhood, education, struggles and accomplishments, and other related topics; and includes photographs, a time line, and an interview with Steve Wozniak.

Lafayette and the American Revolution.

Examines the role of the Marquis de Lafayette in the American Revolution, discussing how the nineteen-year-old defied the king of France to join the fight for liberty in the United States.

Lafayette : French freedom fighter.

Text and illustrations present the life of French general Lafayette, who helped the Americans win the Revolutionary War and then fought for France's poor; also includes a chronology, a Revolutionary War time line, a glossary, and a further reading list.

Harper Lee : a twentieth-century life.

Chronicles the life of "To Kill a Mockingbird" author Harper Lee, discussing her childhood, schooling, aversion to publicity, award-winning book, and other related topics.

Leonardo da Vinci.

Chronicles the life of Renaissance artist Leonardo da Vinci, describing his accomplishments, his artistic techniques, his other areas of study, and the world in which he lived, and features more than one hundred illustrations.

Leonardo da Vinci.

A biography of Leonardo da Vinci focusing on his scientific rather than his artistic work.

Whaam! : the art & life of Roy Lichtenstein.

A picture book biography of American pop artist Roy Lichtenstein, discussing his work as a teacher and innovator, and his lasting influence on the art world. Includes examples of his paintings.

George Lucas.

Traces the life of the man who became well-known for his Star Wars movies, from his childhood in California to his career in films.

Nelson Mandela.

Chronicles the life and accomplishments of Nelson Mandela, a South African political activist who was imprisoned for his rebellion against racial segregation and was later elected as the first black president of South Africa; and features headlines from news stories during his lifetime.

Annie Oakley, the shooting star.

Sharpshooter and exhibition shooter

Political profiles : Barack Obama.

Profiles the life and achievements of President Barack Obama, discussing his childhood, family, education, influences, work with public housing in Chicago, visit to Kenya, marriage, and political career.

Michelle Obama : an American story.

A biography of Michelle Obama, covering her upbringing on Chicago's south side in a stable family environment and the historical context of her life that shaped her into an influential individual.

Pelé : soccer superstar.

A brief biography of former Brazilian football player, Pele, that chronicles his life and achievements.

Rachael Ray : food entrepreneur.

A biography of Rachel Ray, who has become a successful television chef and personality on the Food Network, with photographs and a discussion of her sayings, techniques, and popularity.

Ronald Reagan.

Examines the life and times of President Ronald Reagan, discussing his childhood and education, career in the entertainment industry, his entry into politics, the major events of his time in office from 1981 to 1989, and his post-presidency years.

Rembrandt.

Chronicles the life of seventeenth-century Dutch painter Rembrandt, discussing such topics as his marriage, his studio, and his major works, and describes the world in which he lived.

Introducing Rembrandt.

Provides information about the life and times of seventeenth-century Dutch artist Rembrandt, discussing different periods of his life, and looking at his work as a painter, teacher, and etcher.

Cal Ripken, Jr. : star shortstop.

Text and photographs present a brief biography of Cal Ripken, Jr. who holds almost every major league baseball record a shortstop can have.

Sports great Cal Ripken, Jr.

A biography of the superstar shortstop for the Baltimore Orioles.

Jackie Robinson.

Examines the life of the first African-American man to play in major league baseball.

Promises to keep : how Jackie Robinson changed America.

A biography of baseball legend Jackie Robinson, the first African American to play in the major leagues, as told by his daughter.

Sitting Bull and the Battle of the Little Big Horn.

Tells of the Dakota Indian Chief who led the tribes in the defeat of General George Armstrong Custer and the United States Army in the Battle of the Little Big Horn.

Elizabeth Cady Stanton : social reformer.

Presents a biography of Elizabeth Cady Stanton, social reformer, abolitionist, and woman's suffrage advocate, providing information on her childhood, her passion for woman's rights, and her achievements.

Jim Thorpe : legendary athlete.

A biography of one of the greatest all-around athletes in history, probably best-known for his record-breaking track and field performance in the 1912 Olympic games.

Tom Thumb : the remarkable true story of a man in miniature.

Chronicles the life of Charles S. Stratton, who stopped growing about six months after his birth in 1838 and began performing as a curiosity named Tom Thumb, including discussion regarding ethical questions about exploitation.

Tutankhamun : the mystery of the boy king.

A biography of Tutankhamun, Pharaoh of Egypt, including information on his burial and the discovery of his tomb.

Tutankhamen.

Presents an overview of Tutankhamen's life as well as his influence on history and the world.

Elizabeth Van Lew : Civil War spy.

Presents a biography of Elizabeth Van Lew, a Union spy during the Civil War, providing soldiers with money, food, and books, and includes information on her childhood, her passion to fight slavery, and her achievements.

Mr. Sam : how Sam Walton built Wal-Mart and became America's richest man.

Examines the life of Sam Walton and discusses how his competitive nature aided in the building of Wal-Mart and his wealth.

Andy Warhol : prince of pop.

Chronicles the life of pop artist Andy Warhol, describing his childhood in Pittsburgh, the development of the Factory, and his rise to fame.

Elie Wiesel : witness for humanity.

A biography of Holocaust survivor, writer, and humanitarian Elie Wiesel that discusses his childhood, life in the concentration camps, accomplishments, and other related topics; and includes photographs, a timeline, and an interview with Sara Bloomfield.

Oprah Winfrey : a twentieth-century life.

Examines the life and career of television personality and media magnate, Oprah Winfrey.

Frank Lloyd Wright.

Step One: Using a print source and the Cornell Note Taking Method, obtain an overview of your chosen subject. Properly cite your source(s).

1. Open a Word document
2. Put "Your Name" and "Mrs. Barth, Period #" on the top right
3. On the next line, title the document "Works Cited" and align it to the center
4. Type in your book citation, using the feedback on the exercise we did in class last Tuesday. Pay special attention to punctuation!
5. Click "Save As"
6. K Drive -> 7th Grade ELA -> BarthPeriod__ -> Save using your name as the title
7. Minimize (-) the document [Don't close (x) you will need it today!]

Step Two: Using your notes, the databases, and Google images **fill in your script** and **collect images** for your Photostory. Properly **cite your sources**.

To save a photo:

1. Right click on the photo
2. Click “save as”
3. K Drive -> 7th Grade ELA -> BarthPeriod__ -> Save using your person's initials and a description “JFplayingfootball” or “JFhometown”
4. Remember to CITE the photo on your Works Cited: highlight and copy the citation at the top of the page and paste it onto your Works Cited page



ONLY when your script is done AND you have at least three photos from the databases:

1. Go to Google.com; click “Images” on the top bar (Do Not Use Bing!)
2. Search for a photo, click on the photo to open it
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4. Remember to CITE the photo on your Works Cited: highlight and copy the URL on the right of the picture (NOT in the browser bar) and paste it onto your Works Cited page

Step Three: Import your photos and record your Photostory.

Open Photostory

1. On the computer, click “Start” in the bottom left corner
2. Click “All Programs”
3. Select “Photostory 3 for Windows”
4. The button for “Begin a new PhotoStory” should be selected, Click “Next”

Import Photos

1. Press the “Import Pictures” button
2. Go to the K Drive -> 7th Grade ELA -> BarthPeriod__ folder and select your pictures
HINT: *If you hold the CTRL button on your keyboard down as you click on the thumbnails of pictures, you can select more than one at a time.*
3. Repeat until you have all of your pictures imported.
4. You are now ready to arrange your pictures. To move a picture, select its thumbnail in the timeline, and click the left or right arrow. To delete a picture, select its thumbnail and click X.
5. You can save a project for your story at any time while working on the story by clicking the **Save Project** button. Go to the K Drive -> 7th Grade ELA -> BarthPeriod__ In the **Save As** dialog box, type a name for the project. You must save a project for your story to be able to edit it later.

Recording your script

1. Get a set of headphones and microphone
2. Once your pictures are imported, click “next.”
3. On the title slide, you may type a title and your name, click “next”
4. Now you will begin recording. Click on the red dot, when it is flashing, you are recording. Click the black square when finished. Click “preview” to listen to your recording.
5. If you messed up and need to re-record click the circular arrow and click “yes”
6. If you are happy with your recording hit “next” and repeat steps 4-6 until done.
7. You can save a project for your story at any time while working on the story by clicking the **Save Project** button. Go to the K Drive -> 7th Grade ELA -> BarthPeriod__ In the **Save As** dialog box, type a name for the project. You must save a project for your story to be able to edit it later.

If you finish your project early, you may add transitions and music, but not until you are done importing & recording, and have saved!





- Be careful that your script is written in full sentences so it makes sense to your listeners when you record it!
